### UIU Birth – Grade 3: Inclusive Settings Major 2018-2019 Catalog

The following are also requirements for a student majoring in Early Childhood Education:

- The courses listed in the transfer guide above are for the Birth – Grade 3: Inclusive Setting Major only. A student considering other majors or endorsements in the Teacher Education program at UIU will need to work with the university to determine an individual transfer plan.
- A student may transfer up to 78 credits.
- Transfer guides are updated each year. A student should work with an advisor to assure he/she is using the most recent transfer guides.
- A student must maintain at least a 2.70 cumulative GPA to be admitted into the Upper Iowa University Teacher Education Program.
- A “C” or higher is needed in Composition I, Composition II, and a speech course as well as in any EDU, ECE, and SPED prefix courses. Transfer grades lower than a C- will not be accepted.

- A student must successfully pass the College Basic Academic Skills Exam (C-BASE) in Reading and Literature, Writing, and Mathematics with the following minimum scores:
  - Reading and Literature: 235
  - Writing: 235
  - Math: 235
 Each section of the exam may be taken a maximum of three times. (Praxis Core scores minimum in each area are also accepted. Reading: 156 Writing: 162 Mathematics: 150)
- A student must submit to criminal background checks and have no serious charges in these checks.
- Praxis II Test Requirement: State regulation requires a student wishing to be recommended for Iowa licensure take a content test and a pedagogy test and attain qualifying scores. Completion of the teacher education program and qualifying scores on the tests do not guarantee a candidate recommendation for teacher licensure. Serious deficiencies shown by the candidate in one or more areas of personal or professional development could result in no recommendation or in additional preparation by the candidate.
- A student may ask a transfer advisor about other endorsement options including but not limited to:
  - English/Language Arts K-8
  - Instructional Strategist I K-8
  - Instructional Strategist II Learning Disabilities/Behavior Disorders K-12
  - Instructional Strategist II Intellectual Disabilities K-12
  - Social Studies K - 8
  - ESL K - 12
  - TAG K - 12
- Note: It is strongly suggested a student obtain a Reading endorsement.

### **Footnotes on Specific Courses**

- With proper documentation, practicum hours from EDU 213 Introduction to Education may be transferred for EDU 110 Foundations of American Education hours. EICC students transferring to UIU will need the following documentation to receive credit for UIU courses:
  1. Documentation of lab courses with practicum hours. Documentation will include log/calendar, contract with agency/school (if other than EICC Child Development Center), evaluation from cooperating/supervising teacher, and activities/tasks as noted on checklist, in journal or some other means.
  2. Documentation of 20 hours working with infants and toddlers.
  3. Documentation of 40 hours working with preschoolers.

- Current CPR certification for which documentation is provided to UIU.
- **A student who transfers to UIU with an Associate of Arts degree in liberal arts from Eastern Iowa Community College will be considered to have fulfilled all Upper Iowa University general education requirements.**
